- 3. **The practice**: The Research Cell of the college organized this state level student seminar. The organizing committee called for papers from various institutions to present the same. Total 100 students in and outside the college participate in the seminar. The participants accompanied with their guide teacher and presented paper in the seminar held on March 2017.
- **4. Evidence of success**: This seminar gives the students a new experience on how to present a seminar paper in state or national level.
- **5. Problems encountered**: All students cannot be covered to participate in a seminar because of time constraint.

Morning Assembly for Spiritual Development

- 1. **Goal**: To assemble students in morning assembly for moral and spiritual development.
- 2.
