Organisation of State Level Inter-College Students Seminar

1. **Goal** :- To encourage and motivate the students for developing academic investigation, scientific outlook and conducting research on various issues of society.
2. **Context** :- Our present society is covered by various types of problems. Without scientific and systemic study it is impossible to overcome such problems of the society. To acquire sufficient knowledge on these problems the college encourages students' community for conducting research studies.
3. **The practice** :- The Research Cell of the college organized this state level student seminar. The organizing committee called for papers from various institutions to present the same. Total 100 students in and outside the college participate in the seminar. The participants accompanied with their guide teacher and presented paper in the seminar held on March 2017.
4. **Evidence of success** :- This seminar gives the students a new experience on how to present a seminar paper in state or national level.
5. **Problems encountered** :- All students cannot be covered to participate in a seminar because of time constraint.

Morning Assembly for Spiritual Development

3. **The practice**: Principal and teachers of various departments conduct morning assembly. At 8.50 am before their classes students assemble in the college auditorium and pray the almighty. After the prayer, the principal delivers a speech in brief about the thoughts of the day, good news etc. Beside this he also declares some information to students regarding examination, attendance of classes and other activities of the college.
4. **Evidence of success**: - A discipline is seen among the students and the college as well.
5. **Problems encountered**:- Although it is good effort, but not possible to ensure the involvement of all students of the college. All the students cannot attend the college at the prayer time everyday as they have to cover from distant rural areas.
